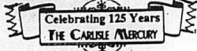

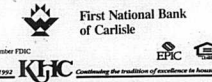

Bicentennial projects complete

CARLSLE — As the year-long celebration of Kentucky's Bicentennial winds down to its final two months, projects started to celebrate the occasion are gradually nearing completion.

In Nicholas County, the major project was the continued renovation of the Nicholas County Jail. Several groups participated in going donations to see the building's revitalization. But aside from the jail, see other Nicholas County organization has sponsored a number of projects throughout the year, the Nicholas County Historical Society.

In its efforts to preserve and document the rich history Nicholas County contributes to Kentucky, the Historical Society has been especially successful in procuring and completing a number of special projects which is not so readily evident.

Not only has its membership contributed about \$2,000 to jail renovation, Nicholas County's official Bicentennial project, which came from the dues and donations of Society members, but it also came with the second edition printing of the History of Nicholas County.

The new history, aside from including its original text, was published in a hard bound book with an important update — a Surname Index and the addition of maps edited from the 1976 edition.

A membership drive is underway to increase both its size and the Society's role in continuing to support various community projects in the interest of Nicholas' history.

There are a number of projects slated for 1993 and the Society encourages everyone

to participate in anyway they can. Joining, however, is the best way.

The next project planned by the Society is the restoration of gravestones in the oldest known section of the Carlsle Cemetery. Due to time, weather, and erosion many of the old gravestones are becoming just barely readable.

Some are being overgrown with grass and date back to the late 1800s. Some are the only remaining mark left by county ancestors.

If cost feasible, the project will be one of the largest mounted by the Society and will require the efforts of any willing to help. You don't even have to be a member; just contact any one of the Society directors and let your interest be known.

Since its founding in 1974, the Historical Society has always been open to any and all who wish to join and has enjoyed a large enough membership that dues to join won't send anyone to the poorhouse. At always dues are \$7.50 per couple, \$5.00 for single membership, and \$1.00 for students.
