Parents should get involved in their children's education

Parents who take an active role in their child's education can encourage better learning, while also becoming involved in their activities and interests in the child's "other" life.
"Children who feel their parents are interested and involved in their activities are more eager to learn," said Gary Hansen, Extension Specialist in Sociology for the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.
"They also achieve more than children whose parents are uninvolved or disinterested in their daily programs," Hansen added.
The best way to start is by opening communication lines between parent and teacher, he said. Parents need to keep teachers informed of changes at home, such as illness or travel, so they will be better prepared to handle any problems which arise at school. Such communication lets teachers know that parents are interested. It also gives parents an opportunity to ask questions or make suggestions.
