The Bluejackets scored once in the first half off a pass rush forcing the interception which Wes Broderick carried into the end zone with 7:37 to go in the second quarter. But the 14-0 score was as tight as the ball game got. The Greyhounds prevailed over the Bluejackets 56-26 in the first undisputed loss the Jackets suffered all season.

Whereas before, time and crucial mistakes forced the Jackets to fall short of the win, the Greyhounds executed an almost unstoppable first string offensive attack. Projections had already been made about how strong the Greyhound's bid for the district title was at midseason. Despite still being heavy on sophomores and juniors, however, the team has, as the Bluejackets game made clear, gained well as a team.

Paris came out knowing the Bluejackets' weakness on the ends and took full advantage. But even at that, the Jackets managed to grow during the course of the game against an experienced and determined opponent.

Beginning at the Nicholas County 25 yard line, put there by a kick return from Mike French, the Jackets began to mount a fairly consistent ground game. Kevin Watkins took the ball inside for three straight plays, mopping up 10 yards for the first down.

Around the ends, however, the Greyhounds' pursuit held Ron Newby to a five yard gain on second down before the Jackets resorted to the punt.

At the end position, Duane Kenney was responsible for some good first links on the runners, but they refused to fall. Wes Broderick nailed the receiver after a pass completion gave Paris a first at the 30 yard line.

Cunningham took the ball 19 yards to the 11 yard line and the other running back, Jackson, went in for the score despite Duane Kenney's attempted tackle at the line of scrimmage.

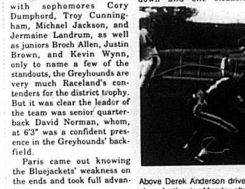

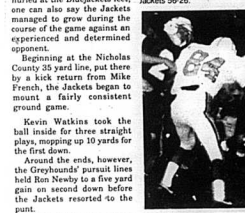
