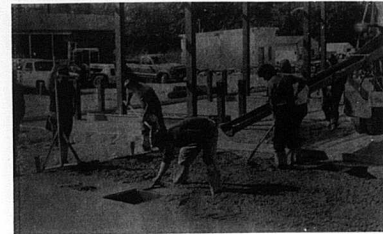


Carlisle's two newest businesses to open in November

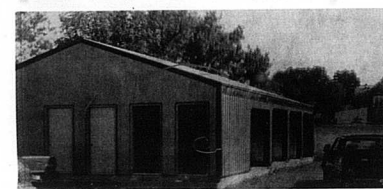

Clark's Mini-Storage fall victim, temporarily, to Murphy's Law, private business in Carlisle has been on the upswing throughout the course of 1992, despite a recession.

It became obvious quickly. And as the siding was being added to the outside Monday afternoon, Clark said it won't be long before the storage building will be open for rental.

Just suddenly began. Before the end of a week, the frame of "I don't know whether a

thing like this will go over with people or not. But I've had some people wanting to rent space in advance and I don't know of any other place in Carlisle that runs a place specifically for storage," Clark said.

The building is, for the most part, complete. Construction is down to the detail and Clark felt that within a few more days he could get started. It comes equipped with four 10 x 20 units large enough for a good sized boat or car. In addition there are four 5 x 10 units and five 10 x 10 units.

However, aside from the new storage business down Old Paris Pike, just up the road construction is continuing on a new Chevron station and food mart in the lot where Crockett's self-serve car wash used to stand.

Although funding for the new business is provided by Bobby Crockett, owner of Crockett's Footdown in Carlisle, the store is primarily the idea of Carolyn Crockett, Footdown's co-owner.

A great deal of time, Crockett said, has been spent in the planning stage for the development and layout of the new station. Its construction, and completion, has been much anticipated.

One of the more significant additions planned for the new business, however, is not so much the outside, although a great deal of work has been expended in that direction, but on its layout indoors.

"California style" is the way in which the main interior of the store will be built. Basically the cashier's desk will be centrally located in circular fashion with items lined up along its walls. Ample seating has been planned as, it seems, the pattern to these stores is not necessarily concentrated on those people interested in just a quick in and out visit.

should be cleared up, though. In emergency or urgent situations, there are no huge waiting lists.

But for specialized medical treatments, especially the more technologically advanced, a six to eight week wait is not uncommon, he said.

"There are phases and nuances to both systems. Our system is essentially controlled by the government budget, therefore access to some health care is difficult. Taxes can be high as well. In the United States, people can get some services immediately, but individual costs are often high," Dr. Peters said.

Medical care issues, however, are not part of his decision to set up practice in Carlisle. It is an interest to serve in a new place in an area where he feels welcome. Carlisle just happened to fit the bill.
