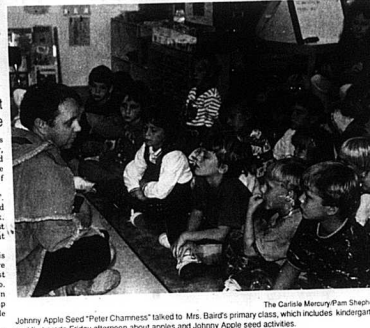
He is a 1973 graduate of Nicholas County High School, attended Centre College in Danville, Kentucky, and graduated from the University of Kentucky with a degree in business administration.
