

Hardin lives in UK study intense residence hall

Jill Hardin, a University of Kentucky freshman from Carlisle, chose to live in a "study intensive" residence hall.

"I need to be in an environment where I can study," she said. "I need to keep my grades up."

Hardin, a 1992 Singletary Scholar and a member of the UK Honors Program, is one of 130 students living in UK's new study-intensive residence hall, Boyd Hall.

Built in 1990, Boyd Hall is hardly a "new" residence hall. Located on the north side of campus, it is completely surrounded by other residence halls - Blazer, Jewell, Holmes and Patterson.

"Boyd Hall is open to any student who is interested in a study-intensive living and learning experience," said Christine Havice, who, as director of the UK Honors Program, has been a driving force behind the establishment of the program.

"Our students and their parents have been asking for this," Havice said. Over half of the students living in Boyd this semester are members of the UK Honors Program.

Boyd Hall's "new look" includes a computer learning center with 30 work stations linked to UK's computer network to first step in the university's plan to provide such computer links and facilities in all residence halls.

"A classroom. A library with an expanded reference section, and an expanded social, cultural and education activities loosely based around the Honors Program."

Boyd is a co-education facility, with women and men living on different floors.

"For the most part, students living here respect your need to study," she said. "We are also rather closely knit."

The daughter of Judy and Thomas Hardin, 113 Oriole Street, Carlisle, Hardin is a 1992 graduate of Nicholas County High School, a National Merit Scholar and a member of the UK Honors Program.

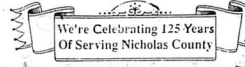
Hardin and many of her friends do living in Boyd Hall were 1992 Governor's Scholars. "We all know each other and that makes living here much more pleasant."

A mathematics major, Hardin plans a career that relates in some way to mathematics. "I'm not sure what that will be," she said.

"She would advise high school seniors to 'not panic. Classes can be tough, but when you finally learn how to budget your time, and you get organized, it's not so bad,'" she said.
