The foods will be distributed at Senior Citizens, 324 West Main Street on Wednesday, September 9 from 8:30 - 11:30, Community Action, 149 Scrub Grass Road on Thursday, September 10 from 1 - 4:30 p.m. Misrepresentation of need, or sale or exchange of USDA commodities is prohibited and could result in a fine, imprisonment, or both. USDA Emergency Food Assistance Program is available to all eligible recipients regardless of race, color, national origin, age, sex, or handicap. If it is necessary for someone to pick up your commodities, you must stand with that person.
