Kenney was named "Coach of the Year" by receiving 26 votes from a pool of 270 high school coaches throughout the state.

Head Coach Donnie Gray of Clay County, the state's former number-one ranked girls' high-school team, was runner-up for the title.

Kenney, a 19-year veteran to coaching, said Tuesday she didn't know if she was a good coach, but she knows she did have an excellent team this year because of their experience and determination.

"I enjoyed the association with the kids. This team was filled with talent and a very dominating player (Kim Derkins) and all the special ingredients that made it a good team," she said.

Most of all, she said she hoped she was a good influence on her team and other children in the community.

"I had a phone call from Las Vegas, Nevada. He was a former player of my husband's (Mike Kenney)," she said. "And he said 'You all don't realize the impact you can have on a child's life.'"

Although the losing seasons for many years discouraged her and made her think about leaving coaching, Kenney said she is glad she never gave up her goal entirely.

"I never did want to give up. It was always a dream of mine to have a winning team," Kenney said.

"I wanted a winning team, so when you walk in a gymnasium, the other team doesn't look at you and say 'We're going to win.'"

Those teams look to her and the Lady Jackets as an example now, as her peers vote demonstrate.

Smoot plays 'hard ball' with the Ky. All-Stars

Pleasant News - A group of boys from the Ohio State University, who missed February with a knee injury, led Kentucky with 14 points. Harless added a dozen smoots to seven.

In the boys game, Kentucky scored the final five points to edge the Ohio stars, 58-54.

Ohio picked up its first gift free throw midway through the half when the shot banged off the backboard and ricochet through the hoop.

The killer came with 12 seconds left when Connie Fazio banked home the front end of the bonus and then scored a more conventional freebie to break an 82-82 score and provide the final margin.

"The Kentucky girls had an opportunity to come back, but they couldn't," said Coach Paul Rice.

Smoot's layup was blocked out of bounds. A three-pointer by Jess Williams of Allen Central, just ahead of the mark.

Kentucky led much of the game and was on top by 10 points, 55-45, on the second half. Russell's Melissa Brown midway through the second half.

However, the momentum turned as Ohio went to a full court press and the Kentucky guards were unable to handle the pressure. Marlene Stollings, Miss Basketball for Ohio with a 42.5 point per game average, scored the next nine points.

Smoot finally regrouped when Coach Paul Rice invited Nikki Smoot of state champion Nicholas County into the back court. Just as she did in the state tournament, the Bluejeet guard handled the pressure.

"Smoot also hit four pressure-packed free throws down the stretch to give Kentucky the opportunity to win."

Following an Ohio time-out with 1:25 left, Smoot drilled two freebies to give Kentucky its final lead at 80-78.

Stollings, however, scored the next four points to give Ohio its first lead of the second half.

Smoot tied the game for a final time with two more free throws at the 28 mark.

Fazio had an opportunity to put Ohio back in front, but missed the front end of the bonus with 22 seconds left.

Jackie Harless of Sheldon Clark rebounded for Kentucky, but instead of passing the ball to a guard, she tried to dribble the ball up court. As she tried to dribble up the right side line, she stepped out of
