Thinking of buying a new air conditioner? asks Nicholas County Extension Home Economics Agent, Maureen Burch. Op- Murphy, Extension agricultural engineer at the University of Kentucky's College of Agriculture.

"Home owners can spend anywhere from two to six times the initial purchase price on utility bills over the life of the unit," both Burch and Murphy say.

"An efficient unit will have a SEER, or seasonal energy efficiency rating, of at least 12. The government's minimum efficiency level for air conditioning units is 10.

While some units go as high as 15 SEER, their high initial cost may not make them cost effective with the new low electricity rates in Kentucky, Bill Murphy advised.

"Another important criterion to consider before purchasing an air conditioner is the home's current heating system.

"If the home has a ceiling cable, electric baseboard, or some other expensive heating system such as an old inefficient oil or propane furnace, consider buying a heat pump instead of an air conditioner."

"A heat pump can heat and cool a house," Murphy said, "and costs only a few hundred dollars more than an air conditioning unit."

Moreover, it will likely have the home owner a lot of money on heating bills during the winter.

The most efficient heating and cooling system is a geothermal unit, he added.
