NOTE A - SUMMARY OF ACCOUNTING PRINCIPLES

The Nicholas County Fire Department financial report covered in this report includes only the checking accounts and certificate of deposit, the property tax collections received in conjunction with a Special tax levied on all property assessed for taxation in the county, and miscellaneous contributions received by the Nicholas County Fire Department.

Principles Determining Scope of Reporting Entity
The financial statements of the Fund consist only of the funds and account groups of the Fire Department.

Basis of Accounting
Basis of accounting refers to when revenues and expenditures are recognized in the accounts and reported in the financial statements. Basis of accounting relates to the timing of the measurement made, regardless of the measurement basis applied.

Funds are accounted for using the cash basis of accounting. Revenues are recognized when they are received. Expenditures are recognized under the cash basis of accounting when the liability is paid.

Revenues and Budgetary Accounting
No budget was adopted.

Fund assets are recorded as expenditures of the fund. The scope of our audit did not include fixed assets account group for assets placed in prior years.
