## Bluejackets show promise; versatile style

CARLISLE — The Nicholas County Bluejackets, under the direction of head coach Chris O'Hearn, look forward to a new year of growth and competition.

"We didn't lose any seniors last year and we have one player who transferred in, so it looks like we've really grown," O'Hearn said.

But O'Hearn does not want to emphasize starting positions.

"We are working for the right combination to work together for the win. Every one person is important, and because you start doesn't necessarily mean you are most important," O'Hearn said.

Nicholas County squares off against teams from Grant, Fleming, Madison Southern, Rowan and Pendleton Counties to name a few.

"Our schedule is very similar to last year's schedule. It is competitive, but we go into every game with a chance to win," O'Hearn said.

"Our opener on Tuesday against Montgomery County is our toughest. They have an excellent transfer student and they have the size.

"They start with guys 6 feet 8 inches, 6 feet 5 inches and go from there. We will have to do a stellar job of blocking and staying on those boards to stay with this team."

But Nicholas County also has its advantages.

"Our biggest pluses are number

one, we're deep, and number two, we're versatile," O'Hearn said.

"We have got nine or 10 people who can play right off the bat — in other words, we can wear our opponents down because we have an inexhaustible supply of fresh people.

"And we've got different combinations of styles of play. We can go bigger and stronger, or we can play quicker and smaller, versatility is the key and I feel we have that advantage over many of our opponents."

The NCHS head coach said game plans are also unlimited and the goals and style of play will be determined by the opponent.

"We feel like if we can control the tempo and play of the game, we have

a more than good shot at a win," O'Hearn said.

"I can't say we play a basic running game, although we can compete in a running game style of play.

"We base our decisions on the basic type of team we have to meet on the floor on a given night, we focus on minimizing turnovers and capitalizing on the talent we have."

O'Hearn added community support has always played a vital part of enthusiasm on the court and off.

"We look forward to a great season. And we also look forward to the community support we've always enjoyed. It's good to see the stands filled with fans and it makes the players even more positive," O'Hearn said.
