Jackets beat M.M.I. 98-62 in regionals

The Lady Jackets made an exceptional start in the Boys' Class "A" Regional Tournament last Wednesday when the team grounded the M.M.I. Cadets 98-62.

Broderick, who replaced Stacy at 1:30 in the third, went long with the ball at 7:30 in the fourth and dunked it for a 76-41 lead.

The final point scored in the game was by Simpson, who hit a layup with 10 left on the clock. The final tally was 98-62, a clean win for Coach Chris O'Heam's Bluejackets.

"That was a game that we were really favored in," O'Heam said after the game. "It was a different role for us, and we wanted to play hard and get the job done."

Denkins had a difficult time guarding the Fillies' 6'2" guard Dorothy Boyers. Boyers, who is much larger than Denkins in body size, would rack up points for the Fillies by standing under the basket and hooking in the balls.

Denkins was busy guarding Boyers at 7:05 in the second, keeping her at bay defensively and offensively and working the ball into a three-pointer at 4:33.

At 6:27, Stacy scored three points from the outside for a 16-8 margin.

Having Wildcats Fugles and Baps foul out respectively at 4:42 and 4:32 on the clock, may have helped to lessen the stress on the Jackets, and almost the Wildcats led 30-48 at game's end.

By 1:52 in the third, the Lady Jackets were falling behind as the Fillies kept hitting three-pointers.

Denkins was fouled at 7:42 in the fourth, Denkins lost two, followed by a throw by Smart at 7:30 to narrow the score to 38-37.

The score didn't tilt to the Lady Jackets' advantage until after 31 in the fourth, however, when Hutton and Denkins' free throws created another victory for the Nicholas County Lady Jackets.
