Rev. Charles Tanner returned home on Thursday from Harrison Memorial Hospital where he has been quite ill the past two weeks.

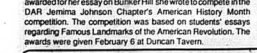

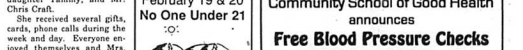
