Before returning to the Persian Gulf, Whalen and his shipmates were part of a three-ship task group that was ordered to Somalia in support of the relief effort Operation Restore Hope. The ship spent nine days involved in the relief effort, playing a significant role in the ability of multi-national forces to secure all eight key relief centers in the famine-stricken country.

The recent takings of the ship are textbook examples of the traditional expeditionary roles. On short notice, Naval Expeditionary Forces are poised to respond to crises in distant lands, from the sea.

Nicholas Elementary receives two state grants for art study

Frankfort - Nicholas County Elementary has received two \$6 state grants to support the arts in the school this year.

According to Marilyn Moshnick, Chair of the Kentucky Arts Council (KAC), \$6 Teacher Incentive Program (TIP) grants worth a total of \$65,000 have been awarded to schools in Kentucky to support artist-in-residence programming during the 1992-1993 fiscal year. Elementary, middle and high schools in all six Congressional districts will receive funding for arts education activities.

Teacher Incentive Program grants are part of the Artist in Residence Program, which places professional artists in Kentucky schools and communities to demonstrate art forms and share their creativity with students.

The TIP projects involve an artist's residency of at least five days. Projects may focus on any artistic discipline or combination of disciplines.

"The TIP brings the arts to life for children throughout Kentucky," Moshnick said. "It puts students, teachers and artists together to share in the creative process."

Martin Newell, Executive Director of the KAC said "TIP grants reach a significant number of communities that are underserved by traditional arts organizations. The TIP projects often provide students with their first arts experience."

Artists who participate in the program are selected from a pre-approved list of artists throughout the Kentucky Arts Council's Artist in Residence program, or are qualified non-resident artists selected by local arts administrators. Most have had experience working in Kentucky schools.

Recipients of TIP grants provide arts programming to the public without regard to race, color, creed, religion, national origin, age, sex, or disability. In addition, facilities used for arts programming are accessible to persons with physical disabilities.
