

Deadline nears for local elections

January 26 is the filing deadline for candidates in Nicholas County who plan to be on the ballot in the May primary election, according to Secretary of State Bob Habbage.

"We expect as many as 10,000 persons to be a candidate for elective office in 1993," Habbage predicted.

Habbage said the filing deadline for independent candidates and for municipal races where cities have opted to forgo nonpartisan primary elections will be on August 2. Candidates for such offices would appear for the

first time before voters on the November ballot.

Persons seeking election to local office file their candidacy papers with the county clerk, Habbage said. Candidates for office who are elected from more than one county and judicial candidates file their necessary papers with the Secretary of State.

Officials to be elected in 1993 include mayors, city council members, all county officials, district judges, Commonwealth Attorneys, and circuit clerks. Candidates elected to a local office in 1993 will serve an

additional year for this term only. Commonwealth Attorneys and circuit clerks elected in 1993 will have a single seven-year term and beginning in the year 2000 elections will be held every six years.

Circuit Judges and Judges of the Court of Appeals elected in 1993 will have single seven-year terms and beginning in the year 2000 elections will be held every eight years. Officials normally elected for a four-year term such as city and county officers and district judges elected in 1993 will have a single five-year term and in 1998 elections...
