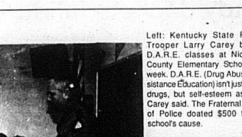

It is being taught to the four six graders at the school.

Nicholas County to receive extra funds

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local government or private voluntary organization must be chosen to receive funds. The selection was made by the National Board that is chaired by the Federal Emergency Management Agency. The Board consists of representatives from the Salvation Army, American Red Cross, Council of Jewish Federation, Catholic Charities, and United Way. The Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.
 A Local Board made up of the County Judge/Executive, Salvation Army, Ministerial Association, and Community Action Council will determine how the funds awarded to Nicholas County are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service organizations in the area.

NOTICE OF REQUEST FOR KENTUCKY POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (KPDES) PERMIT ISSUANCE

The Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection, Division of Water, proposes to issue the KPDES permit to the facility described below:
JOCKEY INTERNATIONAL, Carlisle, Kentucky, 40302, Highway 36. (Permit No. KY0002445.)
 This permit action involves an existing discharge of process wastewater from an underwear manufacturer (bleaching & dyeing cotton cloth) that enters the Licking River in Nicholas County. This permit is being modified because of a request for change in discharge volume. The proposed changes include the installation of a permit. Permit Writer: Mahmood Sarip.
 Persons objecting to the proposed action or the proposed conditions are invited to submit comments in writing to the Division of Water at the above address. The comments must be received by February 27, 1993. The applicant's name and KPDES number should be included in the first page of comments.
 Interested persons may also request in writing that the Director of the Division hold a public hearing on any application. The request must be filed when the comment period and must indicate the interest of the party filing it and the reasons why a hearing is warranted. When no comments are received, the Director will hold a public hearing pursuant to 401 KAR 075, Section 7. After consideration of comments submitted during the comment period and the hearing record, any and all requirements of the Federal and State Acts and appropriate regulations, the Director of the Division will make a determination regarding final permit action.
 Permit applications, draft permits, fact sheets or statement of basis may be viewed at the Division of Water, Business Office, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays. A copying machine is available for public use 10 cents per page. Three (3) days advance notice may be required for inspection of files.
 Please bring the preceding to the attention of persons whom you know will be interested.
