

Jackets fall to Greyhounds

CARLISLE — The Nicholas County Bluejackets went down to defeat Saturday at the hands of the Paris Greyhounds.

The Jackets put up a valiant fight, but finally succumbed. Paris' Alvin Sims did the most damage to the Jackets, scoring a total of 29 points.

On the Nicholas side, Bradley Brown hit the Greyhounds up for a game total of 16 points.

Brown showed his prowess from the three-point line, hitting a total of four for the game. Brown also hit the first points of the game for Nicholas 30 seconds into the game.

The first quarter saw the Jackets score only 8 points to Paris' 22. The Jackets could not stand before the onslaught of Paris' offense, and couldn't seem to catch a break in attempting to break through the Greyhounds' defense.

The first quarter ended with Nicholas trailing Paris, 22-8.

The second half started off well for the Jackets, but things quickly went downhill. The Jackets gave up 18 points in the second quarter, and scored 17. The second half ended with the Jackets trailing the Greyhounds, 40-17.

In the third period, Nicholas kept up their attack on the Paris offense, singling out Alvin Sims.

Bradley Brown and Israel Stacy both hit three pointers in the third to up the score at the end of the third to 60-39.

The Jackets scored their largest number of points in the fourth quarter, with Bradley Brown and Mark Adams hitting from the three-

point line. Wes Bruderrick scored 2 in the third, Brad Burdick hit one for two points, Brian Ockerman scored four points in the fourth, Mark Adams tallied five points in the fourth period, and Israel Stacy came up with two points in the fourth.

The final score was Paris 86, Nicholas County 61.

Mark Adams was second top scorer for Nicholas, with a total of 13 on the game.

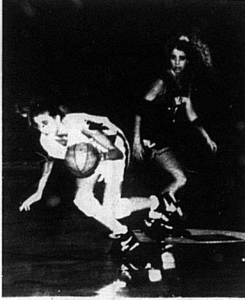

Nicholas County finished the game with a 59 percent average from the free-throw line, as compared to Menifee's 55 percent.
