Depot hunting dates announced

RICHMOND — Dates for the Blue Grass Army Depot 1993 deer hunt have been established. Bow hunts will be held on October 20 and 21, 200 hunt spaces available for each hunt.

On November 6, a muzzleloader/shotgun hunt will be held with 50 spaces available.

Both buck and doe can be taken during this hunt.

A muzzleloader/shotgun hunt will be held November 20, with 100 spaces available.

However, only antlerless deer, including those with the four-inch spike or less, can be taken on that date.

To apply for the deer listing, a hunter should submit a 3x5 card which includes the hunters name, home address, telephone number, including area code, date of birth, and whether the hunter wishes to hunt by bow or gun.

Only one type of weapon will be listed. Information for two hunters can be submitted on the same card.

Hunters must be at least 10 years old.

Hunters between the ages of 10 and 16 must be accompanied by an adult, 18 years of age or older.

Persons born on or after January 1, 1975 must have a valid hunter safety certificate.

The deer hunts are viewed as a management tool. Biological data is recorded at our check station, which is manned by Eastern Kentucky University wildlife biologists and Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources employees.

Firearms authorized for shotgun hunting will be 10 gauge, maximum and 20 gauge minimum with single projectile ammunition of the slug type only.

Firearms authorized for muzzleloader hunts will be rifles with a minimum of 45 caliber using a conical-shaped projectile. Use of a sabot is authorized.
