Park receives honorary doctorate

NORTH CAROLINA - St. Andrews College in Lenoir County, North Carolina has honored Park Communications business Roy Park with the Doctor of Honor Letters. Park is chairman and chief executive officer of Park Communications Inc., which owns and operates nearly 20 newspapers, including The Carlisle Mercury, and television and radio stations nationwide.

The degree was presented to Park last week in his library, New York home by Dr. Thomas L. Rauschling, President of St. Andrews Board of Trustees and former governor of North Carolina, and St. Andrews trustee Angus W. Mercer of Charlotte, North Carolina.

Also present were Park's wife, Dorothy Park, and Jack E. Claiborne, Vice President and Assistant to the Chairman of Park Communications. Rauschling said the presentation and hooding ceremony was preceded by setting breakfast tables. St. Andrews College had never awarded a degree to a non-student on campus.

Park visited St. Andrews in 1991 to receive the college's Fortner Writer and Community Award. He was scheduled to receive the honorary doctorate at St. Andrews commencement this past May but was unable to attend the ceremony for health reasons.

During last week's degree presentation and hooding ceremony, Holthouser read the following citation to Park: "Roy Park, you have influenced your nation, your state of North Carolina and New York, and stand as a magnificent example of one who knows that the destinies are important but The Journey more important still."

A bootstrapper from the starting line, you rose from a 15-year-old boy to the leadership of one of the world's largest communications systems, newspapers, AM and FM radio stations totaling nearly 200 in number in half a hundred states.

Your help to North Carolina's agricultural industry has been innumerable. Your participation in public life has been exemplary and strong support of our colleges and universities. Your several careers, journalism, entrepreneurship with Duncan, and since 1962 your sterling, latest career in Park Communications and the Park Company, shows all of us, young and old alike, that there are always grand challenges and great possibilities.
