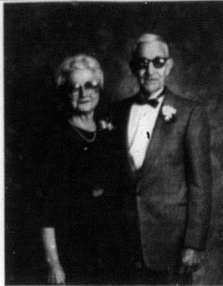

Moore deployed aboard USS Wasp

Navy Fireman Richard L. Moore, a 1992 graduate of Nicholas County High School of Carlisle, is currently deployed and has completed the first half of a six-month Persian Gulf and Indian Ocean deployment aboard the multi-purpose amphibious assault ship USS Wasp, homeported in Norfolk, Virginia as the lead ship of the amphibious ready group.
The 2,500th high deck aircraft landing of the deployment was reached in late April. This significant event came in the wake of the Wasps most intensive period of air operations since commissioning and was achieved in just over two months at sea.
Moore is again participating in Operation Restore Hope, a peace keeping operation off the coast of Somalia. Elements of the amphibious ready group provided a raid, from the sea response force of Navy units and Marine Corps special operations capable assault troops, helicopters, Harrier aircraft, and other amphibious assault vehicles to the multi-national peace keeping force commander in Somalia.
USS Wasp spent 50 days off the coast of Somalia earlier in the deployment. The Marines and sailors are participating in exercise Eagle's Mace in

Shot record must be up to date, on file

Your child's immunization record must be up-to-date by August 18, the first day of school in Nicholas County. If you have been on schedule with your child's immunizations, it's quite simple. First entering school (such as kindergarten or transferring from a private school or out of state), all students must have a physical and skin test. Proof of up-to-date immunization, physical, and skin test must be in official forms supplied by the school, signed by physician and presented to school officials by the first day of school.
Both Grade Bookends and all sixth graders are required to have a physical within the past six months and an additional MMR shot before entering sixth grade. Proof of these must also be presented by the first day of school.
