**Public Notification for Informing the Public of Possible Impact to an Important Land Resource**

The U.S. Department of Agriculture, Farmers Home Administration (FmHA) is considering a preapplication for financial assistance sponsored by the Sharpburg Water District. The specific elements of the project includes the construction of 22 total miles of waterline extensions to serve 146 new customers in both and Nicholas Counties. In addition to the waterline extensions proposed, improvements to the existing system are proposed including the "looping" of existing dead end lines within the water distribution system. If implemented, the proposed action may impact important farmland and designated flood plain within the corridors and/or sites of the proposed improvements. The purpose of this notice is to inform the public of this possible result and to request comments concerning (1) the impacts of the proposed location of farmland and flood plain (2) alternative sites or actions that would avoid these impacts, and (3) methods that could be used to reduce these impacts.

P-23 students work independently. But they are not in the past three years. Nicholas County is one of 100 out of 46 according to the pay scale for teachers," said Jim Simms, superintendent for the group.

"Health care, inflation and other factors have all increased. We have a higher education requirement to fill which pretty expensive."

"Right now we employ 69 teachers even though we only qualify for 75 according to the state. Now, I could lay off about 10 teachers that make us overstaffed and you would get 10 percent pay increase," Gilbert said.

"The state didn't recommend a pay increase but we gave 2 percent to teachers. I know that's not fair across the state could get paid the same scale, but each county sets that."

"We think the teachers should draw consideration, raised rates and we are 100 percent behind non-classified workers, but in order to draw good teachers and keep good teachers here we have got to have an attractive salary," Simms replied.

The board made no motion on teacher salary increases, but said it would be taken into consideration.
