 Do you remember from your childhood, the story of David and Goliath? They after they the army of Israel stood awestruck with fear. It wasn't the Philistine army as a whole that intimidated them. You see, they had in the past many victories over the Philistine army. The difference this time was that one man stood between Israel and victory. This one man was no ordinary soldier. Goliath, the champion of the Philistines, that not one soldier was willing to come up against him. Any one who would fight Goliath would certainly be taking a risk — a life and death risk.

Enter David. When he heard Goliath, this young shepherd boy was appalled that anyone should defy the armies of the living God. 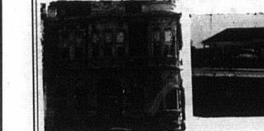
