The program which identifies high school students with academic potential and works with them to finish high school and continue on to college. The year-round program includes tutoring, monthly trips to Lexington Community College and a six week residential program each summer. During the summer program, students live in the dorms on the University of Kentucky campus and are involved in a busy schedule of classes as well as cultural and recreational activities.

Upward Bound is an educational program which identifies high school students with academic potential and works with them to finish high school and continue on to college. The year-round program includes tutoring, monthly trips to Lexington Community College and a six week residential program each summer.
