**TANNER**  
 Rev. Charles Tanner, 70, Hick-Hardy Pike, died Friday morning March 5 at Harrison Memorial Hospital.  
 Born in Wilmore, Kentucky to the late Cecil and Martha Isabelle Stevens Tanner, he was a retired Methodist Minister and teacher. Rev. Tanner was discharged from the United States Naval Service December 22, 1945 in Great Lakes, Illinois after having served in the Caribbean in the World War II.  
 He was a graduate of Kentucky Wesleyan University and Newry University in Atlanta, Georgia from which he earned a Bachelor of Divinity Degree. He later continued his educational studies at Georgetown College, Morehead State University, and the University of Kentucky. Upon completion of seminary, he served various charges in the North Georgia and Kentucky Conference with the United Methodist Church.  
 During that time he was very active with the foundation of Aldersgate Youth Camp in Irvine, Kentucky. Rev. Tanner also served on the Methodist Board of Education in Lexington and was officially appointed as chaplain of M.M.I.'s campus and taught various subjects for 17

years.  
 He retired from United Methodist Church as a full time minister in 1987 but took a part time appointment at Concord United Methodist Church in Palmouth until he again retired in December 1992 due to ill health.  
 He was commissioned by the Honorable Order of Kentucky Colonel in 1986 and was a member of the Masonic Lodge Orient #600 at Headquarters, Kentucky.  
 He is survived by his wife, Delma Williams Tanner; his step-mother, Norma Tanner; Florence, two sons, Charles W. Tanner II, and James C. Tanner; a step-son, David Lake; a daughter, Margaret McQuinn, all of Oymbans; a step-daughter, Karen Suedkamp, Alexandria, a sister, Martha Justice, Cocoa Beach, Florida; seven grandchildren and two step-grandchildren.  
 Funeral services were 11 a.m. Monday, March 8 at Ware Funeral Home by Dr. Charles Turkington, superintendent of the Northern Kentucky District. Burial was in Millersburg Cemetery.
