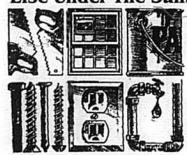

To all interested citizens of Nicholas County, Kentucky. The Kentucky Department of Local Government is accepting applications under the 1993 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. The following information concerning the CDBG Program is available for public inspection.

- Amount of funds available and range of activities that may be undertaken.
- Estimated amount of funds proposed to be used for activities benefiting persons of low and moderate income.
- Plans for minimizing displacement of persons as a result of activities assisted with CDBG funds and plans for providing assistance to those persons to be actually displaced as a result of CDBG funded activities.

The above information is available at the Nicholas County Courthouse on March 18, 1993 through March 25, 1993 during regular business hours.

The County will hold two public hearings. The first public hearing will be held on Thursday, March 25, 1993, at 6:00 p.m. at the Shargburg Fire Station in Shargburg, Kentucky. The main purpose of the hearing is to obtain views on housing and community development needs, review proposed activities, past use of funds, program performance, and to inform citizens that technical assistance is available to help groups representing low and moderate income persons in developing proposals.

The second public hearing will be held at a later date.
