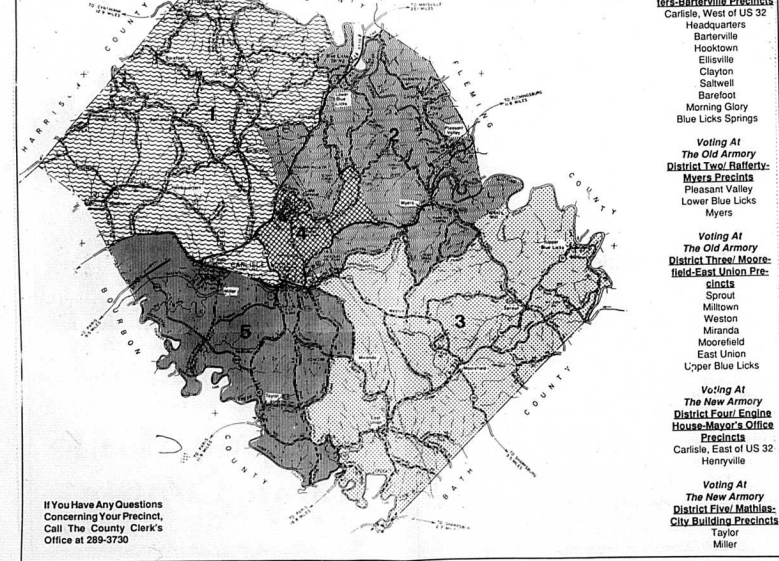

 four part time aides used for primary were only for this year.
 "Gilbert added that Nicholas County was only funded for two aides and two teachers in that area and they already had four teachers, and four part time aides."
 He said, "We are really overstaffed when it comes to aides because we have more than we are getting paid for."
 "We have to decide where we are going to draw the line, if we are going to have teacher salary raises and other things like that, we need to have more aides. I would be nice to have a full time aide in every room, but again, we have to decide where to draw the line."

"Besides the site base council decides where the aides we have are placed, maybe more need to be moved to primary."
 Mrs. Baird, a K-1 teacher, replied, "I have an aide in the morning from 8:30-11:30 and that is when we really get all our important work done, like reading, math and small group time."
 "That aide is not cutting or missing, she is working with those children the entire time she is in that room and many times the volunteers her afternoon."
 "I think we must look at the success of the program, the positive changes we have undergone and what this decision is going to cost children."

"Studies have shown that the most important learning time is the first year in school, KERA (Kentucky Education Reform Act) has given us enough to work out and we need to set a positive example."
