Adolescents talk to other adolescents about their problems more often than any other group or person. A survey taken in 1985-1986 discovered that adolescents turned to: Friends 28%, Parents 26%, Relative 10%, Adult Friend 8%, Nobody 5%, Clinic 4%, School Counselor 3%, Clergy, Coach, Teacher, Activity Director split the remaining 15%. For this reason the PEER HELPING/PEER NURTURING PROGRAM

was developed. The goal of the Peer Helper program is to train a nucleus of students who can help meet the needs of their peers in the school environment. These students, once equipped, can help address issues such as, substance abuse, teen pregnancy, abuse (physical, sexual, etc.), grades, relationships, etc. The program participants develop a variety of skills and activities to meet these needs.
