SBDM defined: A decentralized, shared decision making process in which the local school council (SBDM) will be composed of the following members: The principals as the chairman; two parents and three teachers.

The purpose of this meeting shall be to elect the school council parent members.

All parents are invited to submit those names that satisfy the qualifications and who are willing to put in hard work and time in the interests of our children.

Deadline for nominations is May 21, 1993.

Profits up for DGC

Dollar General Corporation reported a 52% increase in earnings on a 17.7% sales increase for the quarter ended April 30, 1993.

Chairman and CEO Cal Turner, Jr. said net income for the quarter rose to a record \$5,922,000, or \$0.17 per share, compared with \$3,864,000, or \$0.11 per share, for the first quarter last year, after an increase of 37 basis points primarily due to increased purchases of imported merchandise which carry higher initial margins. Accrued shrinkage of \$,868, at cost, is unchanged from the first quarter last year. A LIFO charge of 0.64% was accrued, the same as for the comparable period in fiscal 1993. Cost of goods sold is determined in the first, second and third quarters utilizing estimates of inventory shrinkage, inflation and markdowns. Adjustments of these estimates based on actual results include the cost of goods sold in the fourth quarter. Hardline and softline departments accounted for 67% and 33%, respectively, of total sales compared with 63% and 37% in the same quarter last year.

Gross margin for the quarter equaled 28.17%, an increase of 37 basis points primarily due to increased purchases of imported merchandise which carry higher initial margins. Accrued shrinkage of \$,868, at cost, is unchanged from the first quarter last year. A LIFO charge of 0.64% was accrued, the same as for the comparable period in fiscal 1993. Cost of goods sold is determined in the first, second and third quarters utilizing estimates of inventory shrinkage, inflation and markdowns. Adjustments of these estimates based on actual results include the cost of goods sold in the fourth quarter. Hardline and softline departments accounted for 67% and 33%, respectively, of total sales compared with 63% and 37% in the same quarter last year.

Operating expenses for the quarter equaled \$52.4 million, an increase of 14.7% over last year. As a percentage of sales, operating expenses were 23.6% versus 24.2% in the same period in fiscal 1993. Capital expenditures of \$5.0 million were unchanged from the same period last year. Expenditures for new, relocated, and remodelled stores totalled \$2.9 million compared with \$2.8 million in the first quarter last year. Inventories were up \$60.2 million for a year ago principally due to better store-in-stock positions and increased purchases from foreign vendors resulting in more merchandise in transit.
