Nicholas County voter registration books open

Nicholas County voters can register to vote in the county clerk's office beginning Tuesday, November 9, according to Secretary of State Bob Babbage.

Kentucky law requires registration books to show the fourth Monday before an election and remain closed through the Monday following an election, he explained.

The National Voter Registration Act sponsored by Kentucky U.S. Senator Wendell Ford and signed into law by President Clinton on May 20 is to be implemented by January 1, 1995. Babbage said he hoped the expanded registration process would be in place during 1994.

Since taking office in 1991, Babbage has put several new programs into place to increase voter registration. Several of the registration programs have received national recognition and now serve as models for increased voter registration in other states.
