Nicholas County Bluejackets destroy Berea Community, 56-20

CABRILE - Nick Pope, senior running back for Nicholas County, rushed a stellar 218 yards and three touchdowns during Nicholas' rout of Berea Community, 56-20, Friday night.

Only two minutes into the game Pope ran for 42 yards, breaking the first points up on the board, 6-0.

Pat Baker added the extra-increase with a good extra-point kick, continuing his perfect record.

Berea's problems were compounded with an illegal procedure on the second down and eight, taking the Pirates back five more yards.

Negan was made on the third down after a tackle by Timmy Hopkins and Berea was forced to punt.

Berea's Ashley Pennington tackled Watkins who gained four yards.

Renald Newby followed up with a gain of five more on the second down and Pope followed with a 21 yard carry.

MOREHEAD — Morehead State University defeated Middle Tennessee State on even ground for the first 15 minutes, Saturday, but for the final three quarters Middle road to a 45-0 win.

Middle Tennessee improved to 3-3 overall and 2-2 in the Ohio Valley Conference, while the Eagles fell to 4-4 and a 1-2 league mark.

Middle amassed 21 first downs to 11 for Morehead, and compiled 449 yards of total yardage, while holding MSU to 207.

The Blue Raiders scored two touchdowns in the second quarter to lead at intermission, 14-0.

In the third quarter Middle Tennessee scored twice, plus added a field goal to take a 31-0 lead.

In the final 15 minutes the Blue Raiders notched two more touchdowns to set the final margin.

The Eagles failed to move past the Middle Tennessee State 35 yard line all afternoon.

Project search continues

By Heather Mathes-Harris OF THE COURIER NEWS CABRILE - According to Bill Guthrie, Director of Special Education for the Nicholas County School system, the school district will be conducting an annual special child search in Nicholas County.

The annual project, called Operation Project Special Child, is designed to identify children ages 0-21 who are in need of Special Education and related services but are not currently receiving such services.

"We have sent letters to every health professional like doctors and dentists in this community who might come into contact with a child who are in need of these services," Guthrie said. "This really goes back to the day when people kept mentally and physically handicapped children at home. We want to find these children and let their parents know what is available."

"Some services which are available include special education classes, physical and occupational therapy and the Headstart preschool program. We also have a contract with the Moore School in Paris, a privately run facility directed by a foundation which deals with handicapped students. They have dynamic personnel there and we have always been impressed with the job they do," Guthrie said.
