KSP begins arrests of offenders

Kentucky State Police began arresting 800 individuals before dawn during "Operation Fall Harvest," the third statewide drug roundup within the last 15 months.

At least 1,341 warrants have been issued against these suspects and charges range from trafficking in marijuana under eight ounces (misdemeanor) to trafficking in heroin (felony). Numerous other drug related charges fall in this range with a total of 882 felony charges and 429 misdemeanor charges.

There are 214 charges of selling drugs within 1,000 yards of a school grounds.

This operation to crack down on street level dealers cost \$174,187 all of it federally funded.
