At this time of the year, look toward the cooler autumn weather and the fall colors. Every year I try to make a trip to the mountains of eastern Kentucky to see the most brilliant foliage.

One strange thing about autumn is that when we look at all those beautiful colors, we are actually looking at dying leaves. The chlorophyll that makes the leaves green stops producing food the hours of daylight grow shorter. As the chlorophyll dies, the colors that were always under the green begin to show.

Sometimes our faults and selfishness can cover up the real beauty of a person that God calls one to be. Like the green that covers up the fall colors that are already there, much good can be found in a person beyond one's imperfections. This calling for change is not always painful because one must be of something that he or she had become attached to. The "why" of our sinfulness is what brings about new life.

All throughout the Old Testament of the Bible, the chosen people repeatedly broke the covenant that they had made with God. Inevitably they began grumbling against Moses. They began to grow impatient with wandering in the desert. Food and water were needed, but the lack led to many deaths. They were not satisfied with their ways. "Why have you brought us out of Egypt to die in the desert where there is no bread or water?" We are disgraced with this wretched food (Numbers 21:5).

There are people faithful to God that would provide for them and eventually lead them to the promised land. However, they had to be first with the Lord. He sent seraphs against them. 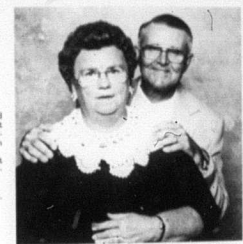
