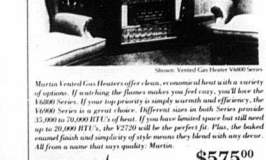

Kimberly, daughter of Danny and Jane Tackitt, is a graduate of Nicholas County High School. Ranked third in the senior class, she was a member of the National Honor Society, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Future Homemakers of America, and French and English Clubs. To be eligible for the Meribeth State University Award, applicants must be admitted to MSU as an entering freshman transfer students must have an Admissions Index of at least 500; transfer students must have at least a 3.00 grade point average in a 6.00 index for the equivalent of at least one full term, and a minimum cumulative 3.00 g.p.a. for each semester thereafter. The award, valued at \$1,000 per year, is renewable for three academic years if the student maintains a 2.50 g.p.a. during the freshman year and each semester thereafter. Applications and information on scholarships and grant programs at MSU are available from the Office of Admissions, MSU, Morehead, Kentucky 40301-1669.
