CARLISLE — Carlisle holds many special and fond memories for Wanda, Faye McKinley Crump — generations of her family grew up and still live in Buchanan County.

One afternoon in 1988, after a family reunion, she decided to preserve these memories for generations to come by writing a cookbook which in full family recipes and stories.

As Crump set down to write the "Doyle's" Adams Heritage Cookbook she didn't realize what an emotional rollercoaster it would be to recall and write a lifetime of memories.

"This is not your run of the mill cookbook, our lives are centered around families and food and it just seems natural to combine the two. I had started a full time job, had a great aunt and a grand mother. We had lost our first love and then a few more. I had just received a letter with a note that this was an emotional fish."

Crump in 1964 and they had three children: Margaret Taylor Crump, Faye and Bonnie Clayton Crump. Crump now has one grandchild, Leslie Ellen Ferrall and son in law, Glen Eugene Ferrall.

Did you ever wonder about how your eyes work?

For example, what happens when you pick up a book and start reading? 1) Your eyes start to function faster than a computer. 2) Six small muscles aim each eye. 3) The pupil of each eye changes in size to regulate the right amount of light. 4) A ring of tiny muscles adjusts each lens so that each word focuses on the retina at the back of the eye. Then cells in the retina send signals from each eye are translated into a picture by the brain. All this happens instantaneously and automatically, but not always perfectly. Any imperfections in the function of either eye affects what and how you see. Most imperfections can be corrected with glasses and/or vision training.
