Health Matters

Exercises to prevent Osteoporosis. Osteoporosis is a disease found mostly in women and is characterized by a decline in bone mass which results in bones becoming brittle and breaking easily.

The decline in bone mass usually begins in women ages 30-35. Fortunately, this condition can be slowed or even prevented with simple exercises designed to increase bone mass.

Weight bearing exercises such as walking, jogging, or running, build bone mass before it starts to decline. Exercise can also slow the decline of bone mass after it has started.
