because the aging structure had begun to sag.
New drains will be installed with funding coming from the general fund, Eversy confirmed.
Eversy commended Phillip Calderin and Cletus Ribick for all the work done at the school. The facilities planning committee for Nicholas County should soon be appointed. Eversy said the board would choose either an 11 member committee or a 17 member committee. Board members thought the board would get better ideas from a larger committee, so they chose the 17 member committee.
Board Chairman Louise Zachary asked if students could be

"You can have as many non-voting members as you like," Eversy replied.
"It's basically like bidding in volume. You save on shipping and price per item," Eversy explained.
