 long overdue transportation. Paris was awarded a \$963,663 grant for wastewater treatment and water treatment plant improvements on Tuesday, August 24, 1994.

Broken County was awarded \$175,225 for a water supply system of approximately 26 miles of water line areas currently unserved by a public water supply, providing service to 155 customers. The Governor began his talk by mentioning unavailable water because of a cause of concern. "Not every day (as Governor) is a great day for this in a good day in the life of a Governor." The Governor assured Nicholas County citizens they earned the federal money. "You got it the old-fashioned way. You worked for it," Jones commented.

Fewer workers Jones talked briefly about the strides made during his administration to reduce the number of state employees. "We have done it through attrition. Officers were laid, who saw nobody leaves, do not automatically fill positions. He filled with workers not getting permission from the Governor."

Kentucky now has fewer 1,500 state paid salaries than before the Jones administration, he said. The attrition has saved \$250 million.

Jones referred to Nicholas County as a "great place to live." He explained his visit as a way of being thankful for the county's stockholders of this big corporation and every now and then you talk to the chairman."
