**Food should be handled with care**

Holiday parties where foods are left out for long time leave the door open for uninvited guests—bacteria that cause foodborne illness. Keep these unwelcome guests away from your pathogen by preparing, handling, and storing foods properly, advises Melba Burch, Nicholas County Extension Agent for Home Economics.

Although bacteria are everywhere, a few types really like to crash holiday parties. These pathogens include Staphylococcus aureus, Clostridium perfringens, and Listeria monocytogenes. These "party crashers" can't be smelted or tasted.

Staph bacteria are found on skin, in infected cuts and pimples, and in our noses and throats. To prevent spread, wash hands and utensils before preparing and handling foods. Do not let prepared foods, especially cooked and served meats and dress and meat salads, remain at room temperature more than two hours.

Perfringens is often called the "cafeteria germ" because it may be found in foods served in quantity or foods left for long periods on inadequately maintained steam tables or at room temperature. Prevention measures include dividing large portions of cooked foods in keep,

turkey, gravy, dressing, stew, and casseroles) into smaller portions to serve and cool. Keep cooked foods hot or cold, but not lukewarm.

Since Listeria bacteria multiply slowly at refrigeration temperatures, the bacteria can be found in cold foods typically served at buffets. To avoid these bacteria, followed "keep refrigerated" label directions and adhere to "sell by" and "use by" dates on processed products; reheat frozen or refrigerated processed meat and poultry products before eating them.

Whether planning a holiday party for a big crowd, or serving a typical family, always follow these food safety principles:

"Wash your hands before and after handling food."

"Keep your kitchen, dishes and utensils clean. To prevent cross-contamination from raw meat juices, always serve food on clean plates—not those that held raw meat and poultry."

"Cook meats and poultry thoroughly to safe temperatures. Cook fresh meats hot to at least 160 degrees F. for medium. Bake whole poultry to 180 degrees; poultry breasts to 170 degrees; and ground turkey and poultry to 165 degrees."

Cook other meat, fish, and ground beef to 160 degrees.

"Keep cold foods cool (40 de-

grees or cooler) and hot foods hot (140 degrees or warmer)."
