Ky. burley growers represented

CARRISLE — According to a representative from the Burley Tobacco Growers Co-Operative Association, burley growers in Indiana, Kentucky, Missouri, Ohio, and West Virginia, were represented at the recent buyout negotiating by a team from the association.
The big news was that the talks may prevent the expected 40 percent or greater quota reduction that had been imminent for U.S. burley farmers in 1995. Nicholas County AGS Executive Director Jim Furniss is optimistic about the talks. "We're not expecting 40 percent out. In other words, they're expecting the quota for 1995 to stay the same as 1994. I think Nicholas County farmers are very, very happy about that. They have a chance for things to stay the same."
Furniss said 880 farms have tobacco quotas in Nicholas County. There are an estimated 1,000 farmers, both landowners and tenants, in the county.

- Present a 40 percent (or greater) quota reduction that will be imminent for U.S. burley farmers in 1995.
- Present a reduction of \$200 million that Kentucky's farm economy would have suffered after a massive quota reduction.
- Present large reductions in land values, tax bases, farm-related activities in rural areas of tobacco-producing states.
- Likely reduce net-net cost.

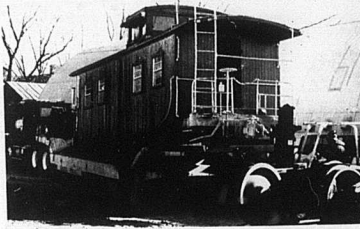

visions that the five manufacturers will over the next seven years.
• Purchase the next upland inventories from the 1993-93 crops.
• Do so in proportion to each buying company's share of cigarettes manufactured in the U.S.
• Be eligible for greater discounts (up to 13 percent for buyout) and up to 13 percent for buyout) to each company also buys at least 90 percent of its annual intentions of new U.S. tobacco during regular auctions.
By law, U.S. cigaretemakers annually declare how much American grown they intend to buy, and based on these intentions, the USDA sets yearly quotas for the production of U.S. tobacco, and American farmers are limited by their allotments from these quotas as to how much tobacco each farm can raise and market.
