The BLM manages 270 million acres of public land in the western states and Alaska, including 35 million acres of public rangelands on which over 46,000 wild horses and burros are protected. To manage both the wild horse and burro herds and the fragile rangeland vegetation, the BLM gathers some animals each year when the population is too large and makes them available to qualified adopters across the Nation.
