Babbage discusses deadlines for precinct officers

Nicholas County Republican and Democratic county executive committees have a March 15 deadline to submit names for the appointment of precinct officers to county boards of elections, according to Secretary of State Bob Babbage.

Each county board of elections has a March 21 deadline for appointing precinct officers for the 1994 elections. Both deadlines are set by state law.

The county board of elections appoints a total of four persons — two judges, one (election) clerk and one (election) sheriff to serve in each precinct for each election.

Once appointed these individuals serve in all elections held in the county during the year.

Babbage, who by virtue of his office serves as the chair of the State Board of Elections, explained that the state board has the authority to review all county board of elections lists of precinct officers.

Several recommendations made by Babbage and Attorney General Chris Gorman are the basis of legislation proposed during the current session of the General Assembly.

Tout takes part in Drug Awareness Week aboard Navy ship USS Salvor

Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Eugene T. Tout, son of Eugene H. Tout of 2815 Moorefield Road, Carlisle, recently participated in an unusual method of supporting the Mothers Against Drunk Driving or "MADD" organization.

Tout who is assigned aboard the salvage ship USS Salvor, homeported in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii, along with the rest of the crew, expressed support for the organization by displaying a bright red pennant which flew atop the ship's antenna in conjunction with Drug Awareness Week. Smaller ribbons were also put on personal vehicles by the crew members.

County receives emergency funds

Nicholas County has been chosen to receive \$2,500.00 to supplement emergency food and shelter programs in the area.

The selection was made by a National Board that is chaired by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and consists of representatives from the Salvation Army, American Red Cross, Council of Jewish Federations, Catholic Charities, USA, National Council of Churches of Christ in the USA, and United Way of America will provide the administrative staff and function as fiscal agent. The Board was charged to distribute funds appropriated by Congress to help expand the capacity of food and shelter programs in high-need areas around the country.

A Local Board made up of the County Judge, Senior Citizens, Department of Social Services, Ministerial Association, Family Resource Center, and Community Action Council, will determine how the funds awarded to Nicholas County are to be distributed among the emergency food and shelter programs run by local service organizations in the area. The Local Board is responsible for recommending agencies to receive these funds and any additional funds available under this phase of the program.

Under the terms of the grant from the National Board, local governmental or private voluntary organizations chosen to receive funds must: The non-profit; have an accounting system and conduct an annual audit; operate nondiscriminatory; have demonstrated the capability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter programs; and 501 (c) 3 are a private voluntary organization, they must have a voluntary board. Qualifying organizations are urged to apply.

Nicholas County has distributed Emergency Food and Shelter funds previously with Community Action Council participating. This agency was responsible for providing 24 families with emergency assistance, and two families with housing assistance.
