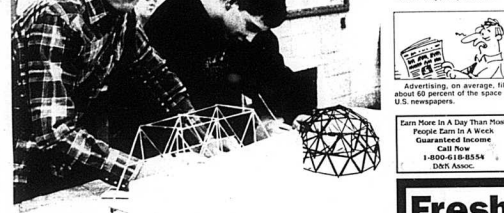

member was opposed to building a new high school.

Chairman James Dale and Sam Vico said no, they were not opposed if the financing was in line. David Simons and Zachary Barton said they were not opposed to a new high school building.

Barton asked if every board member was proud of the remodelled elementary school.

Each board member responded with yes, they were proud of the remodelled elementary school.

She also asked each board member if they were proud of the new bus garage.

"I am glad we have a bus garage," Chavez said.

"A bus garage, yes. But there was a lot of dissatisfaction brought up when I campaigned concerning the bus garage," Dale said.

"I am proud that we have a bus garage to deliver our children," Vico said.

Simons and Zachary responded with "yes."

"I am proud of all these improvements, and I think much of this is owed to the hard work of Mr. Gilbert. He's done a fantastic job," Barton said.

"But I would like to know the reasons why, if you doubted Mr. Gilbert, did you want until the last day of the deadline to not renew his contract which may have caused him difficulty in getting another job since it is such a last day?"

"First of all, he was notified well before the deadline that he did not have enough support for a contract and so, I don't think he as done a satisfactory job."

"A lot of those improvements were in place before he came here. The main thing was to get walls in the elementary. But it didn't work out that way, the bus garage was built first."

"I got feedback when I campaigned, the perception was a vote for me as a vote against Gilbert, people went to the polls and obviously I lost. The strongest message to me from my constituents," Dale said.

"With the concrete bumper, the bus garage, people did not support him. I've got to tell you they ask me today, and they asked me not to support Mr. Gilbert. Boogie Hall, a constituent in Dale's district said, "When Mr. Dale asked me for my signature on his petition in order to run he told me he backed Mr. Gilbert 100 percent."

Zachary called for order and said she would not allow another interruption.

"I did not say I did not support him and I did not say I supported him. This is a clear personal attack on me... It's your word against mine," Dale said.

Vico and his biggest concern is the building of a new high school and the phases of its financing.

"In the first phase we have committed not to raise taxes. We were told we would receive commission support money, that's free money we would not have to pay bonds. But that commission construction money fell through," Vico said.

"Our projected cost was between \$1.5 and 2.5 million. We met with Senator Ed Ford and Mike Lasher, who was then

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with buildings and grounds, and found out we couldn't get that money. James Dale and Sam Vico said no, they were not opposed if the financing was in line. David Simons and Zachary Barton said they were not opposed to a new high school building.

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The wedding will take place Saturday, March 12 at 2:30 p.m. at Locust Grove Baptist Church in Carlisle.

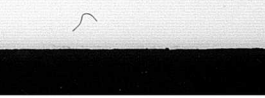
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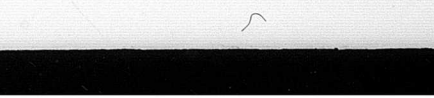
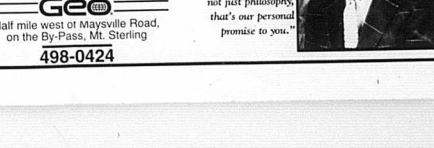
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
