Miss Alexandra Sluder, niece of the bride, served as flower girl.

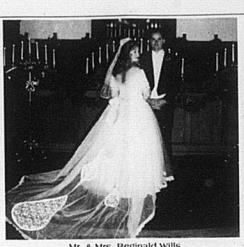

There's something new to remember. From now on, when you need a distance calls to telephone numbers within Kentucky's 502 area code (0 or 1 + 502 and then the number you're calling).

The nation's continued telecommunications growth has created a lot of telephone numbers. By dialing the appropriate area code on all long distance calls, numbers are freed up for new business and residential customers.

If you have long distance numbers within the 502 area code on any named services or equipment like Speed Calling, Call Forwarding, mobile even a FAX machine, now's the time to reprogram them. Effective April 1, 1994, dialing the area code will be necessary to complete long distance to telephone numbers within the 502 area.
