fordable insurance for those with a limited income," Shepherd said.
Betsy Linville, newest member of the JMHC Public Relations network, said dinner will be provided by The First National Bank of Carlisle and Farm Credit Services.
"And we will also be holding prize drawings for farm oriented prizes and we would like to thank all our sponsors for that as well," Linville said.
She also said plans for future programs targeting other residential groups are in the works.
