

Sports Lady Jackets advance to final round; handed first loss of season

SCOTTSDALE - The Lady Jackets advanced all the way to the finals of the 1993 Lady Invitational of the South Tournament before suffering the first loss of the season at the hands of Apollo High School, 60-45.

The Lady Jackets beat three tough teams along the way, including number one ranked Central Hardin and Oregon State Champions Lake. Nicholas County played three games in 22 hours, withstanding fatigue while the Lady Jackets won time zone.

One game had been delayed on Wednesday, December 29, due to inclement weather forcing the Lady Jackets to play two games in one day - facing Lake Oswego Wednesday morning and Central Hardin that same night.

"During our game with Central Hardin Kim (Denkins) fouled out with five minutes left in the fourth quarter," Head Coach Barbara Kenney said. "But the rest of our kids kept their heads together and played really well. Michelle (Hopkins) scored 20 points and had nine rebounds and Tara (Georg) handled the ball really well."

Kenney believes fatigue factor played a major part in Nicholas County's first loss in the finals of the Scottsdale tournament.

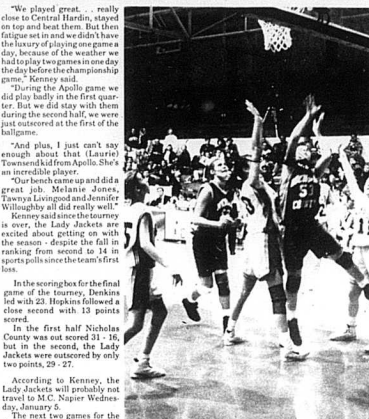
