on health care reform.

"It is my understanding Baehler intends to hold a special forum with rural hospitals. I requested to be involved and have volunteered to give rural perspective and speak to rural concerns," Miller said.

"The rural interest is a viable concern throughout our nation. You can see it in the AMA Guide to the Health Care Field that in a state like Wyoming for instance, their largest hospitals are 200 beds, they only have three hospitals with over 200 beds. In Lexington alone there are five hospitals with 200 and over beds," Miller said.

"In Montana there are hospitals with two beds - there is a 14 bedder in Stillwater, an 11 bedder in Chester, a 42 bedder in Elkton. And the distances are so far apart between hospitals, if these health care facilities were eliminated the people living in and around these places would suffer. And you don't keep doctors unless you have a primary care facility."

Kentucky is in a better situation than many of these less densely populated states and some more rural areas of Kentucky have solved their primary care facility problems - and met rural needs.

"I was involved in creating a hospital in Breathitt County, an area which serves over 40,000 people in Wolfe, Doolittle, Lee and Breathitt Counties," Miller said.

"Before the hospital was built, the five physicians in the area served primary care in office. Most doctors had filling machines in their offices, but what if the office was closed and an emergency arose?"

"Anyone who had a heart attack had to travel the hour and a half to Lexington in an ambulance staffed only with an Emergency Medical Technician - because remember, without a hospital there are no nurses either."

"So rural hospitals can meet the needs and must continue to meet the needs of people within their area, it can mean life and death to some individuals."

"A lot of communities don't appreciate what they've got. It is a whole lot easier to complain, but if the hospital was lost then you've got a problem."

Miller added the loss of a hospital in a rural setting is not a question of economic difficulty, but could be due to legislation.

"We don't want to be legislated out of business. Last year, Governor Jones' essential proposal would have put about 30 hospitals out of business, but the legislature was smart enough not to pass that," Miller said.

But there may be a plan currently in Washington, with which rural health care providers may agree.

"On the federal level, the rural coalition plan is being backed by J. Rockefeller, he's from West Virginia which is pretty rural and pretty poor, just like Kentucky," Miller said.

"But according to the federal government only about 25 percent of Americans are rural. Now that seems like a low number, but you've got to understand a place like Bourbon County would be considered urban because of its proximity to the city. Most people living in that county may not consider themselves urban, but the federal government does."

And Miller insists not only the implementation of a health care plan be broad based, but the payment of this same plan be broad based also.

"It is a popular conception certainly not in Nicholas County that since tobacco products put a lot of people in the hospital, then tobacco farmers should pay for this health care plan. Well bullets put a lot more people in the hospital, but you don't see anyone wanting to put a special tax to pay for health care for bullets anymore than you would see a special taxation of high cholesterol foods. It's ridiculous to think that one percent of the population - if that - should pay for everyone's health care," Miller said.

"The United States has been talking about health care reform since FDR, this now historical social concern has become a political commitment."

"The only other country being discussed and evaluated on health care has been Canada. I don't think the United States will go to any type of socialized medicine," Miller said.

"But I think the final thing everyone must understand is that reform doesn't necessarily mean better, but it means different."
