Coaches discuss teams' chances in the All "A" tourney



O'Hearn optimistic about Nicholas in tournament; says teams well paired

CARLISLE — Since winter weather has thrown a clinker into practicing schedules, many coaches whose teams will compete in the Region 10 All A Classic believe the tourney will prove to be a really close horse race all the way to the finals.
 "We play the winner of the St. Patrick, Bath County game. I can't even project a winner in that one — since everyone's practice schedules have been hit and miss, the weather has really opened this tournament up — many teams are on an equal footing," Bracken County Head Coach Gary McKinney said.
 "Bracken County is an inexperienced team, we don't have a lot of pressure on us to win this thing and there is a lot to be said about being the underdog."
 "We do have some good kids who can play ball. And we have got a good combination of starters, so I think we'll do well in the tournament, especially with it being opened up the way it is."
 Head Coach Randy Harrison of Tollebsohn said his team has straggled some practice time despite the weather.
 "I've got some practice time in late last week and some this weekend," Harrison said.
 With a record of 9-5, the Wildcats have been striving for consistency all season.
 "We [Tollebsohn] like a fast tempo game. We've worked really hard for consistency in our fastbreak game, working man-to-man and the full court pressure defense. These players have really come around to playing." Continued on Page 6

CARLISLE — As the Nicholas County Bluejackets approached the upcoming Region 10 All A Classic, Head Coach Chris O'Hearn looked to the Bluejackets' first opponent — Millersburg Military Institute.
 "I haven't seen MMI play, but based on the scores and seeing the paper, we'll hopefully come out on top after that game," O'Hearn said.
 The head coach also said which team comes out on top in either the bottom or top bracket is a real toss-up.
 "Anything can happen in a tournament. It comes down to who is playing the best at the time, who is at their peak and who is on the downturn — good basketball can be played by the teams who aren't the favorites and the best teams can play terrible ball on any given night," O'Hearn said.
 But he does admit that some coaches do have favorites — or those they plan ahead and scout most before playing — and that's the bottom bracket, are the favorite teams so far," O'Hearn said.
 "Both of those teams have talented and experienced groups of players — they made the finals of the region last year."
 O'Hearn had specific comments on both teams.
 "Supposedly, this is the last year they [Tollebsohn] will have a school because they have a smaller school and the district has opted for consolidation. So they have something to prove." Continued on Page 8
