New ideas may help prevent SIDS

Frankfort, Kentucky (June 28, 1994)—Child health experts are calling for parents to put healthy newborns to sleep on their backs or sides instead of on their bellies to reduce the risk of SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome).

For some infants, sleeping on their abdomens is still recommended. Premature babies, those with breathing problems or upper airway abnormalities and those who have problems with food backing up into the esophagus still should be placed on their stomachs to sleep. Health urges parents to discuss their infant's sleeping position with the baby's doctor.
