

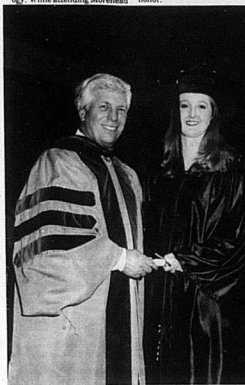

Basler... Continued from Page 1 for only ten years. Basler said the federal Brady Law seems to discriminate against gun dealers, and that he would never vote for a bill that would require registration of guns.

Basler said he got one question, Mr. "Absolutely not," answered Basler. "I got a whole bunch of calls from the other side of the issue. You all may vote against this bill, but you would wonder how I stand on an issue."

Charles Powell, a Lexington gunsmith, addressed Basler's next. "I recently filled out by Federal Firearms License application, and I would like to know why question number 27, the BATT Amendment, both of which restrict gun ownership."

Basler said he did not know, and would research the question and give Powell a reply later. Resident Charles Gates addressed the gathering, stating the statement that only 19 types of weapons would be affected by the bill.

Basler took questions from residents, and at the same time circulated a sheet of paper to take written questions that he did not have time for. Allen Clay Stone, of Myers Road, told Basler that while he has the highest murder rate in the country, yet also has some of the most restrictive gun laws, as well.

Donald Kiser, an owner of Kiser's Sportsman Shop in Paris, closed the meeting.

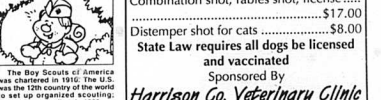
