FFA receives grant

The Nicholas County FFA Chapter has been awarded a \$100 grant under a new grant program administered by the Kentucky Department of Agriculture. The funds will be used for a hydroponic greenhouse, which will involve students with alternative crops and non-traditional production techniques. Douglas Johnson, FFA instructor, and Melba Burch and Mike Phillips, 4-H Council Advisor, submitted the proposal. Utilizing the annual interest earned on the Kentucky Rural Rehabilitation Fund account, the Agriculture Department last year established the state 4-H and FFA Grants Program to assist local projects. Among 96 project proposals which were submitted for the first year of the program, 44 were approved for funding totaling \$59,566. The maximum amount allowed under program guidelines is \$3,000. Agriculture Commissioner Ed Logsdon said the large number of applicants underscored the need for state government to assist local projects. "Our 4-H and FFA leaders have some great ideas for encouraging our young people to become involved in agriculture and community development, but these ideas often are stifled because of lack of available funds," Logsdon said.
